CHURCH FIRE AT 12/12/23 ALDER BROOK

Parishioners Save St. Rose's
After Desperate
Fight

INTERIOR IS DAMAGED Trucks Rush Barrels of Water to Flaming Edifice

Members of the parish of the Roman Catholic church of St. Rose at Alder Brook, came close to losing their beloved house of worship by fire on Saturday morning.

Members of the congregation were gathering to attend ten o'clock mass in honor of the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, when those seated in front noted with alarm that smoke and flames were coming from the wall in the rear of the altar.

The women and children at once left the church. The men attacked the flames which were most threatening. Every man in the neighborhood at once answered the call for help. Water was carried in barrels on a motor truck from a brook. The fire fighters seemed to be waging a losing battle, until they tore out the walls near the altar. Then they were able to reach the seat of the fire and the flames were quickly darkened.

The church had been saved, but the damage was by no means light. The altar and choir loft were partly destroyed, as were several pews. The rear doors were burned and it is also feared the organ was damaged. Many feet of interior wall was destroyed. It is believed the damage will be close to fifteen hundred dollars.

At the time the fire was discovered Father O'Keefe, assistant pastor, was in the church and directed the fire fighters. Father Richard O'Donnell is the pastor of the church, which is situated about one mile from Union Falls.

Father O'Donnell has been in charge at St. Rose's for close to two score years, during which time there has never been a fire scare.

It is believed the fire of Saturday started from an overheated stove in the rear of the edifice.

ASSUMPTION PARISH ^{Fr.} July 21 STILL ALIVE ¹⁹⁷²

GABRIELS "We hear that Loon Lake is alive and growing and that God is not dead, but alive and well and living in Argentina, so it should come as no shock that the Assumption parish here, embracing the Catholic people living in the area from Donnelly's Corners to Onchiota and from the top of Easy Street Hill to the Brighton-Franklin town line, is alive, and, although not in vigorous health, is able to take nourishment says the Rev. Albert Plants, new pastor of the parish and of St. Paul's parish in Bloomingdale.

Gabriels, he says, was once a flourishing parish with a rectory and resident pastor. But, with the closing of Stoneywold Sanitarium and later of Gabriels Sanitarium, the parish lost its resident priest to its mission church, St. Paul's. With the passing of time, it also lost all but a remnant of its parishioners.

Last Sunday the parishioners met with their new pastor and made plans to renovate the church inside and out, and to hold an anticipated Mass at 6:15 p.m. on Saturday, beginning on July 22.
